

Town of Pollock
Town Council Meeting Minutes
January 5, 2026

The Town Council met on said date in a Regular Session at 6 P.M. in the Pollock Municipal Building Council Room, Pollock, La.

The following members were present: Councilwoman Kassandra Hooter, Councilwoman Kayden Carte, Councilman Kenneth Henry, Councilman Sheldon Smith, Councilman Alan Williams

The following members were absent: None

Mayor Beavers called the meeting to order.

Councilman Williams led the Lord's Prayer.

Councilman Smith led the council in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Beavers welcomed all guests.

The meeting opened for public comments or questions from anyone in attendance concerning agenda items only following LSA R.S. 42:14 with a (3) three-minute limitation per person.

Motion by Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilwoman Carte to approve the minutes from the December 1, 2025, regular meeting. Roll call vote: Yeas 4, Nays 0, Absent 1, Abstain 0. Motion carried.

Town Engineer Tom David was present and updated the council on various ongoing and new projects. After the update on the current projects, he noted that the council/town should begin to select a project for CWF and LGAP and present the proposed projects at the meeting on February 2, 2026. CWF must be for water only and LGAP must be for something like roof repairs, gutters, potholes, etc. Mr. David will check and see if the LGAP can be used for barricades for use at town events to ensure safety of the town's citizens.

CPA representative was not present at the meeting.

Chief Chris Paul presented his monthly report. He stated that Pollock Police Dept. assisted the Village of Georgetown and ICE with search recently. Chief stated that Georgetown Police Department had a need for tasers and that his department had recently acquired a grant and that he would like to donate three tasers to the Village of Georgetown Police Department.

Motion by Councilman Williams, seconded by Councilwoman Hooter to enter into an IGA with Georgetown to donate three tasers to Georgetown Police Department. Roll call vote: Yeas 5, Nays 0, Absent 0, Abstain 0. Motion carried.

Chief Paul stated that the 2019 Tahoe has had to have more repairs than is worth and that recently he has had three vehicles donated. A car, truck, and SUV. He would like the council to make a motion to declare the 2019 Tahoe and the 2015 Caprice as surplus for auction.

Motion by Councilwoman Hooter, seconded by Councilwoman Carte to declare the 2019 Tahoe and the 2015 Caprice as surplus for auction. Roll call vote: Yeas 5, Nays 0, Absent 0, Abstain 0. Motion carried.

Water/Sewer Department supervisor was not present.

Attorney Greg Jones was present and had nothing to report.

Councilmember comments: None

Mayor: Mayor Beavers handed out copies from the Lawrason act and explained to the council that a lot of municipalities have gotten in trouble lately for officials, other than the mayor or Ex-Officio for the municipality, signing or entering into contracts on behalf of the municipality. Mayor Beavers reminded everyone that no one other than the Mayor or the Ex-Officio may sign legal documents/contracts on behalf of the town.

Motion by Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Henry for adjournment. Roll call vote: Yeas 5, Nays 0, Absent 0, Abstain 0. Motion carried.
